<b>Environmental Stewardship and Sustainability</b>	All-Season Resort Policy stipulates that all activities carried out within the licensed area must be compatible with the project design and comply with the proponent's and Province's guidelines regarding any potential environmental impacts.	Under the Adventure Tourism Policy, the proponent does not have exclusive use or control of the mixed use license area. Other proponents can apply to use that same area for activities such as natural resource projects. (e.g., logging)
